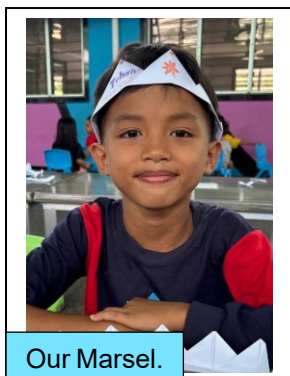

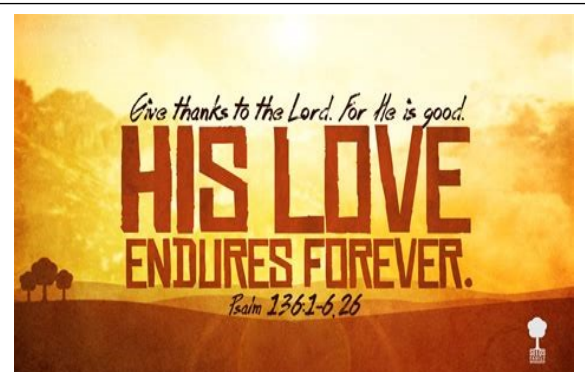

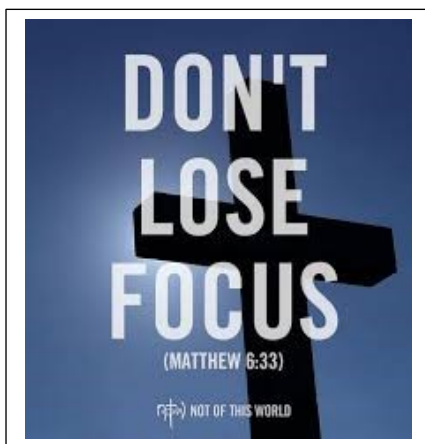
Years ago, as we were tracking through the interior pastoring our own church planters who were stationed in remote villages, we came across a number of church planters from other denominations who were doing it really tough, not receiving any contact or encouragement from their respective denominations. We weren't sure what the reasons for that were but we noticed these people were in great need of a shoulder to cry on, prayer, advice and lots of encouragement. We realized we needed to do something about it and after a time of prayer we came up with the idea to bring these people to our place for a fellowship time so that they can recharge their batteries and just get together to learn from each other's successes and failures, build each other up, pray for each other and just enjoy the body of Christ.

A huge thank you to all those people who have sent donations for this very purpose. You have blessed many of these incredible heroes in the faith.

Dayak Festival:

A number of months ago we celebrated our yearly Dayak festival, traditionally called Gawai. This is a traditional festival amongst the tribal people throughout the island to celebrate the end of their rice harvest where they would normally honor their spirits and idols for a successful harvest. Families tend to come together from afar and celebrate with food, music and all sorts of rituals. Many times, the festivities turn into wild parties, drunkenness and brawls. In our village we have turned it into a thanksgiving festival where we honor

God Almighty for all that He has done for us over the year gone past as well as for the harvest of Dayak souls gathered into His Kingdom this past 12 months. We celebrate with traditional food, music & dance and worship the Lord acknowledging Him as Lord and King. We have children and youth from 74 different tribes in our village and a number of them performed incredible dances and songs in their own tribal language. Some of the choreography was stunning, showing a lot of talent amongst our children and youth from the various tribes. Visitors from many villages, and from afar, came to our village to celebrate with us. Prayer and preparations for such an event already begin months

earlier and everyone joins in to make sure the celebration will be a great success, and that it was. What stuns our Dayak visitors always is that we have such a wonderful, joyous time together but without a drop of alcohol. This is unheard of amongst the Dayak tribes. Often festivities amongst the Dayak tribes cause many getting drunk creating all sorts of tragic issues with grave consequences. Our village however is quite the opposite proving to the Dayak community that you can have much fun and joy without a drop of alcohol. A great testimony of God's goodness.



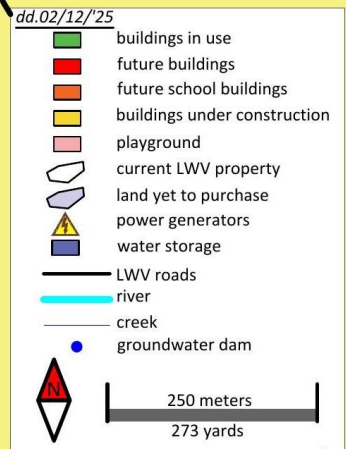

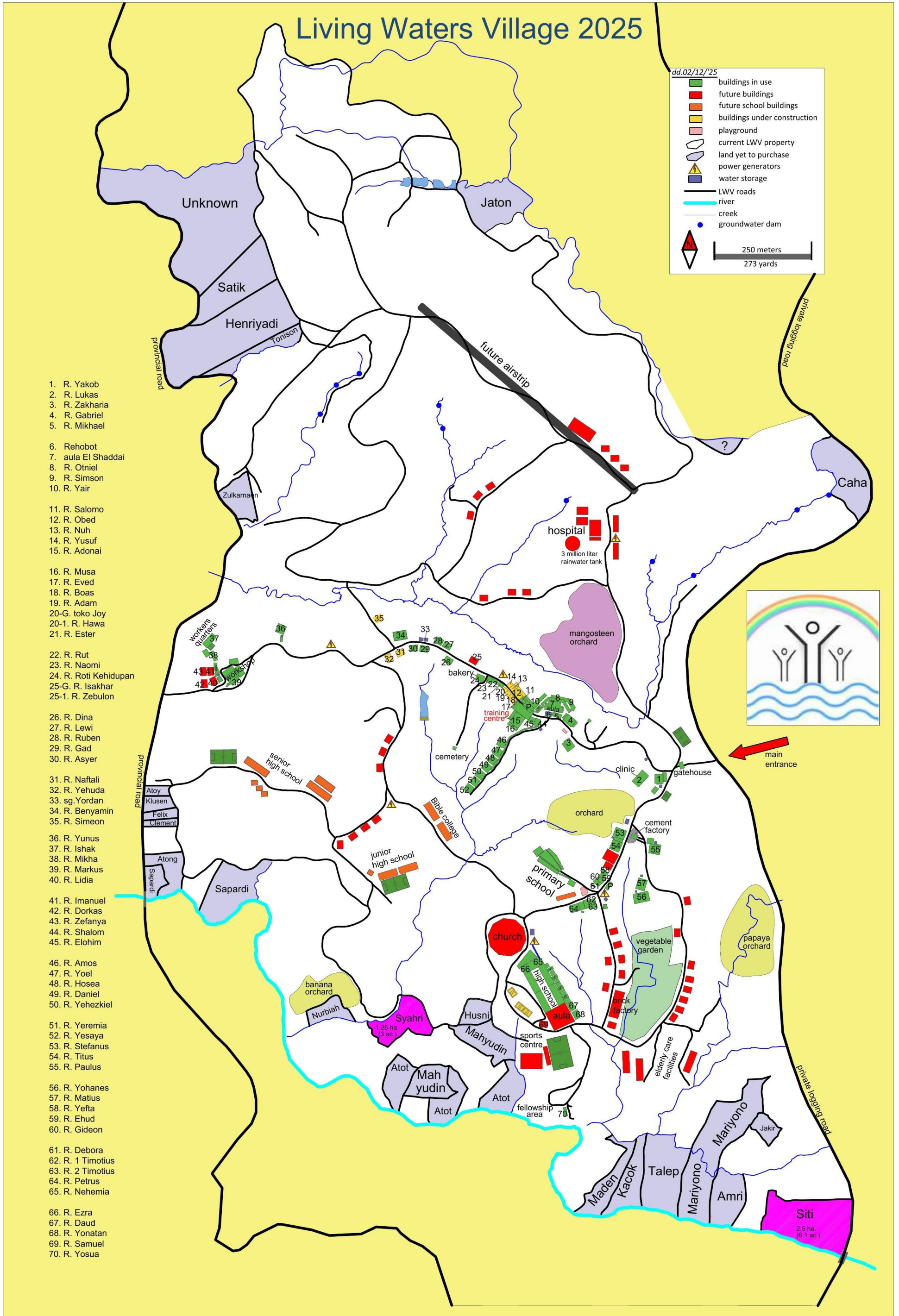

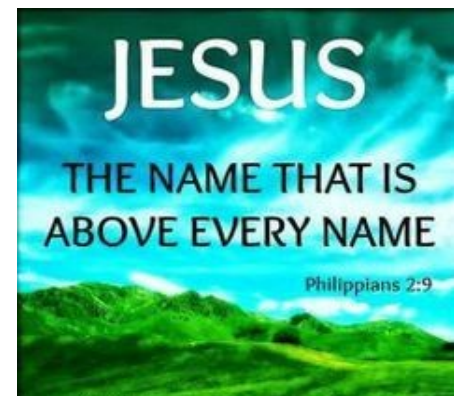

How can we keep our conscience clear? We need to treasure our faith in Christ more than anything else and do what we know is right. Each time we deliberately ignore our conscience, we are hardening our heart. Over a period of time our capacity to tell right from wrong will diminish. As we walk with God, He will speak to us through our conscience, letting us know the difference between right and wrong. Medical Teams:

A number of medical teams from various nations have come over in the last few months to help us out with our medical needs. Their help, advice and expertise have been a great blessing to our own medical team on site. Medical needs amongst our children and youth that are complicated or require surgery we often bring them to Malaysia for treatment. It requires a lot more work for our team but the results are usually much better.

Our famous dentist, Dr Toni from Australia came again last September with Dr Cathy

from Australia, and together with a number of our own medical team did a fabulous job with all the dental work that needed to be done here. They were able to check 819 children and youth, performed 126 extractions and 406 fillings. Much of the work was from mainly new children and youth who have never had access to good nutrition and dental care. The dental team always work long hours in order to get as much done as possible in the 4 weeks they are here. Dr Cathy also taught a lot of dental education to our various schools which was very informative and practical. We are so enormously grateful to them and can't thank God enough for sending them each year here to do all this extremely important work for our children and youth. What a blessing they are.

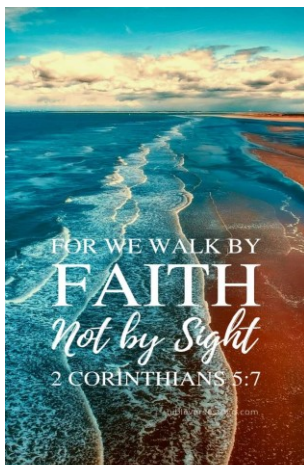

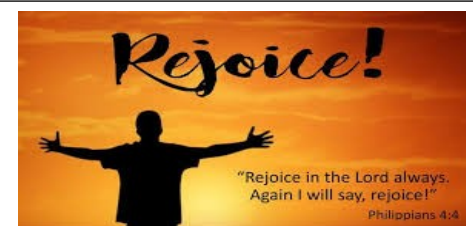
We had one birth since our last newsletter. Our church planter Ratna gave birth to a healthy son which Ratna & Darius named Exchel.

Building Program:

Much has been achieved since our last newsletter. Because of the many projects we are building at the same time we have been able to hire 25 more workers from outside. We do try and create work for people from outside so that they can receive an income and feed their families. There is no such thing as social security payments here. No work simply means no money and no money simply means no food hence they are very grateful when we offer them a job.

Many of the buildings in progress which we mentioned in our last newsletter are still in progress and going well. Massive amounts of concrete have been poured over the many building projects such as the new primary school building (photo right), the high school sports areas, the 13 new houses, huge sewing atelier and massive storage areas for food supplies and non-food supplies.

Our road construction is still in full swing but what a job it is. So much preparation work always needs to be done in order to build good roads that will last for decades. We have had a few setbacks with landslides while building the road but unfortunately that comes with the job at times. One landslide has been fully repaired which took us a few months and the other one is being done now.

Plans are being drawn up for our Bible College. Currently our Bible College operates in a section of our high school but we need to vacate those class rooms soon in order to make way for the student growth in our high school. Our Bible College will require 8 class rooms, hall, library, teacher's quarters and storage facility. On both sides of the Bible College there will be a children's home as well, to make sure there is always human activity on the entire plateau. Please pray with us for a speedy development of this Bible College which will raise thousands of church-planters, pastors & teachers over the coming years.

Plans are also being drawn up for a new concrete block making facility. Our current one is well and truly in great need of replacing. We make thousands of

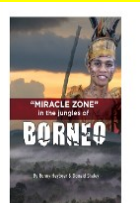
concrete blocks per week which we use for our many building projects, road gutters and retaining walls. The new site is across the road from the old site but at least 3 times as large. The facility will also have a house next to it.

We also need to build a new facility for our rice storage. We already require 15.000 kg (15 ton) per month and rice is not always available, hence we try to stock up for a number of months. Currently our rice stock is stored in a number of Sunday school

class rooms which is ok for a little while but not for long term. Our Sunday school, or Children's Church as we call it today, is growing each week and they need their facilities. Would appreciate your prayers for this need too.

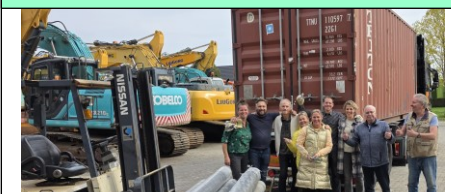

Some of our boys unloading the container.

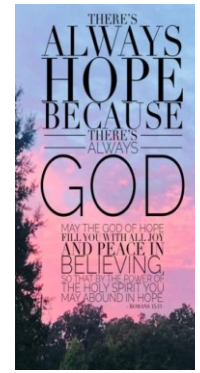




The arrival of two new passenger trucks which is such a wonderful answer to prayer. Thank you immensely to those who prayed for this and those who send funds for this.

Slowly but surely, we are reaching our goal of owning all the land within the natural borders so that there will be no more border disputes now and in the future. Please do keep praying for the pieces of land in lila colour which we still need in order to prevent border disputes. The names of the owners are mentioned so that people can pray more specifically.
- For the container from Holland full of goods from various people. What a blessing again. It was filled by a fantastic team of people and sent and received by another group of fabulous people. The container arrived safely in Kuching and unloaded by a number of our wonderful guys. The goods will be transported to our village early January. A huge thank you to everyone who made this possible.
- For all the marriages, engagements, birth and graduations that have taken place in past few months.
- For funds that arrived for the two new passenger trucks. Absolutely awesome.
- For all the incredible training programs by various teams from Java and overseas such as Kids Reach Ministry & House Spectrum Ministry who train onsite counsellors to help new children coming in who have been traumatized. Also, they helped with specialized training for our "special needs children" and program training how to keep children safe.
- For the successful ministry trips to Singapore, Holland & Germany.

All of us here in our village thank you all immensely for your huge input in the lives of all our children and youth. You are a blessing. Thank you again. May our Lord Jesus Christ continue to bless you abundantly in all you do for Him. Ronny (in Borneo), (Kay in Australia) and all our children, youth and team at LWV.
